

Dear Wyomissing Neighbors,

The leaves and the temperature are beginning to fall, and people are spending more time indoors. Now is a great time to explore all the wonderful things the Wyomissing Public Library has to offer. In addition to our popular children's storytimes, our new Adult Program Coordinator, Miss Jill, has done an exceptional job securing speakers, organizing monthly book clubs,

and offering movie events. We have been listening to you, our patrons, and are changing with the times to provide a community gathering place for both young and old. As you peruse our Fall Newsletter, I hope you will find something of interest to you. Come out and join us for one of our many engaging programs!

We had an outstanding summer at the library this year. During our popular ten-week Summer Reading Program, 403 children and teens read over 11,000 books. An average of 30 books per child! In addition to boosting reading skills, Miss Joie focused on educational programs for all ages providing almost 100 programs this summer. We also expanded our adult programming by offering activities such as Crafternoon, Meet the Geek, and Art Film Matinee. Program attendance is up 26%! We are thrilled to have more community members utilizing our services.

Even though we receive over 50% of our annual budget from the Borough of Wyomissing, we rely heavily on the generosity of our community members to help balance our budget. Each year, we are tasked with raising \$60,000 for the library through individual gifts and fundraisers. So far this year, we are \$20,000 short of our goal. I hope you realize the value the Wyomissing Public Library provides to our community and will consider making a tax-deductible donation to the library. We truly appreciate all the support we receive!

Wyomissing Industries: A Historical Perspective

November 7, 2015 at 1:00 p.m.

At the turn of the 20th Century, Ferdinand Thun & Henry Janssen forged several business ventures in Wyomissing including Textile Machine Works, Berkshire Knitting Mills, and Narrow Fabric Company. These businesses came to be known collectively as Wyomissing Industries.

Historian Mark Vaught will share original vintage materials and provide an introduction to these prominent men, and how they impacted the lives of thousands of Berks County residents. The presentation features a 20 minute official documentary film on the Wyomissing Industries from the 1950's.


